



OFW Ministry Symposium – “Blessing OFWs to Bless the Nations” by Nono Badoy

The ^{1st} public presentation of the Philippine Missions Mobilization Movement (PM3) 2020 Vision of raising 1-million intentional cross-cultural disciple-makers was done during the OFW Ministry Symposium at the VCF-Galleria last April 15, 2011 with the theme “Blessing OFWs to Bless the Nations”. Over 400 participated in this historic event. To God be the glory for the overwhelming response!

Highlights of this historic event are the following: (1) Touching testimonies of a former OFW and his wife, (2) The Audio Visual Presentations of Ministry Resources for OFWs from some Partner Ministries like the Living Springs International (LSI), CBN-Asia, Campus Crusade for Christ (CCC), Far East Broadcasting Company (FEBC) and others, (3) Talk on OFW and the Bible by Nora Lucero, head of the Philippine Bible Society, (4) Presentation of the PM3 Vision by Nono Badoy, (5) Presentation by the author Dr. Robert Clark of the “Higher Purpose for your Overseas Job” training course, a PM3 prescribed training to teach OFWs that there is a higher purpose in working overseas that is not just to make money but to make disciples, (6) Presentation of Dr. Jojo Manzano, the main editor and one of the authors of “Worker to Witness”, also a PM3 prescribed training to make every would-be OFW discover his/her potential as a tentmaker and prepare himself to become one, (7) Recognition of “The Kairos Course” as an excellent missions mobilization & training tool, an eight-session, interactive course on world Christian mission, designed to educate, inspire and challenge Christians to active and meaningful participation, (8) A Report about Pinoys in the Arabian Peninsula by RS, (9) Dr. David Lim’s presentation on the Role of Churches in raising Tentmakers, (10) How to Set-up an OFW Ministry Desk in your local church by Ana Gamez, a missions mobilizer and strategy coordinator for Japan modeled by her home church Tanauan Bible Church (TBC), (11) Pastor Ed Montero the Senior Pastor of TBC shared his testimony as a pastor of a church with an OFW Ministry Desk, (12) Zaldy Barotil, chair of the Mobilization Task Force shared how they were able to get the ministerial fellowship of Cavite engaged in Missions, (13) Prayer time for OFWs, Churches and the Nations, (14) Break-up groups, (15) Final Challenge & Commitment by Bishop Ef Tendero, the National Director of the Philippine Council of Evangelical Churches (PCEC).

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the steering committee chaired by Ptr. The PM3 Summit

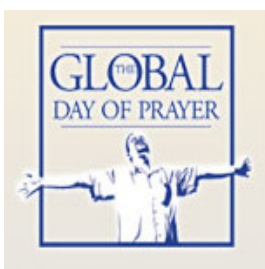
After the successful staging of the OFW Consultation at VCF Galleria, a much smaller gathering of mission leaders along with others who attended the OFW Consultation came to Capitol City Baptist Church on April 18, 2011 for the Philippine Missions Mobilization Movement (PM3) Summit.

This time about 60 came to the summit. Ptr Rey Avante, the senior pastor of CCBC, welcomed the participants. After that Ptr Bob Lopez gave the message on the history of PM3. Dr Joy Tira followed after further explaining the Diaspora movement not just of Filipinos but of the whole world. Testimonies of what God is doing in the Middle East and in the Buddhist world were given by Ptr. Raul Santos and David Lim respectively followed with a prayer for the Global Filipino Church. Ptr Nono Badoy, the Executive Director for PM3 followed after with the recent accomplishments of PM3 and gave some points on what will be discussed on the afternoon.

Some notable items on the PM3 Agenda were:

- The PM3 vision statement was revised: “ PM3 is a global movement of the Filipino Church and partners committed to glorify God by mobilizing, equipping, and deploying 1,000,000 intentional cross cultural disciple makers by 2020 to catalyze church multiplication movements among the least reached peoples.”
- The organizational structure: instead of a linear top down chart, PM3 is a network thus the structure is a circle with the inner body comprising the Global Management Team, with the National Facilitation Team (NFT) along with the new International Facilitation Team (IFT).
- The seven task forces created for this Global Management Team are: Mobilizers, Training, Deployment, Research, Communication, Prayer and Resource Development

Bishop Ephraim Tenderso gave a closing message tackling on Acts 13:1-13 highlighting the 4 Qualities of a Sending Church that would also be reflected to the Philippine church: 1) Promote liberty, 2) Preserve Unity, 3) Practice spirituality, 4) Premium Obedience and a challenge with the signing of the PM3 Covenant.

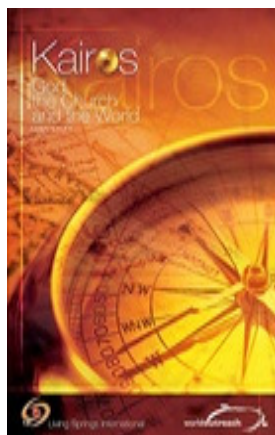

PMA ON THE MOVE

490 Years of Christianity in the Philippines

When Ferdinand Magellan discovered the Philippines and planted the Cross on the Island of Cebu on March 16 1521, Christianity was introduced in the Philippines. Eventually, the Philippines, as a nation, become known as the only Christian country in Asia.

The Kingdom of Jerusalem Hallelujah Foundation and other Christian groups (members of the Body of Christ in Luzon, Visayas, Mindanao; ABS Gen Herbs International and other groups) worked together to declare March 16, 2011 as the year of Yahweh-God's Redemption and Favour for the Republic of the Philippines – the 490 Years Hallelujah Jubilee of Jubilees.

A grand opening celebration was held at the Luneta Grandstand on March 16, 2011, with the unfurling of the largest Philippine Flag. It's the year or 365 holy days of celebration for the Philippine Christian Community.

On March 17, 2011, a Consultative Meeting was held at the Rockwell Ballroom, Luna Garden, Makati City, sponsored by the same Christian groups where they shared and discussed the 490 years of Christianity in the Philippines. It was attended by national Christian leaders in the Philippines led by Bishop Dan Balais, Chairman of Intercessors of the Philippines; Sis. Grace Galindez-Gupana, Ambassador of Peace and Goodwill for Jerusalem to the World; Bishop Greg Durante, and many other Christian leaders, who shared their vision and insights about the significance of the Jubilee.

Dr. Rey Taniajura, National Director of the Philippine Missions Association (PMA), together with Ptr. Andy Ducay attended the consultation on behalf of PMA. Dr. Taniajura was asked to speak on PMA's vision and mission. He also shared an insight on the situation affecting the OFWs today.

Upcoming events were announced, even prophetic visions for the Philippines were pronounced, and in the concluding part of the meeting a prayer for the re-dedication of the Body of Christ in the Philippines was delivered. The consultative meeting ended, though late in the evening – as an occasion for rejoicing. – *Ptr. Andy Ducay*

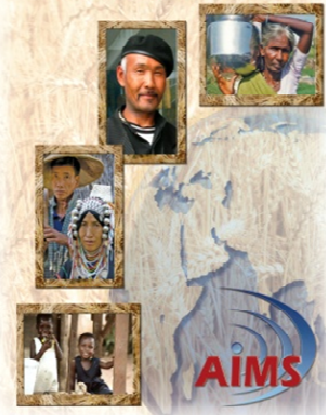

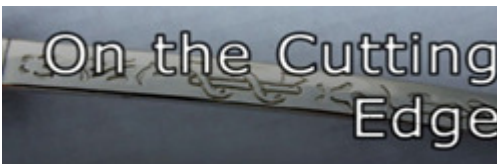

to participate in the Great Commission and gives specific opportunities for individuals in your church to become involved.

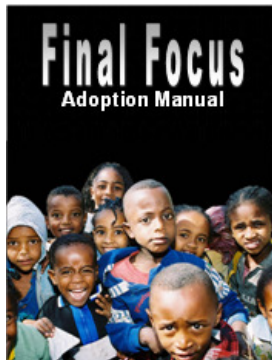


ON THE CUTTING EDGE SEMINAR

HARVEST SEMINARS ... at PMA Office

The 2nd Harvest Connection Facilitators training was conducted April 6 at the PMA office. It was attended by mobilizers and trainers from Asian Center for Missions, Alliance of Philippine Partners in Enterprise Development, Inc. (APPEND), Conservative Baptist Church, and 3 from Youth With A Mission. Eight new facilitators graduated from this facilitators training.

Training of facilitators was done by Dr. Rey Taniajura and Joel Syyp of PMA Communications.

On the whole, the seminar is very light and easy to understand. Good for one day only. A very good transferable training materials. Most significantly the seminar highly encourage churches to adopt or focus on reaching the least reached peoples with the goal of establishing church planting movements in their midst.

It helps us also to evaluate the current missions status (activity) of our churches. Most of us are saddened on the realization that our churches are lagging behind or are not mission minded. This challenges us to really bring this seminar to our respective churches or circle of influence. May the Lord give us much success.
