I really appreciate your participation in the process of exploring how we can move forward together to ignite a massive and sustainable mobilization of the youth in churches across the country for meaningful involvement in cross-cultural ministry locally and globally. We have identified the challenges in mobilizing youth for missions and came up with possible solutions and action steps.

Thank you for all your valuable inputs and contributions during the discussions. Together with God's wisdom, we were able to identify major challenges that we face in catalyzing a massive and sustainable mobilization of Christian youth in cross-cultural ministry namely:

1. Commitment – Apathy (Me centered), Commitment & Fear, Sustainability
2. Cross-cultural Missions Education & Training – Ignorance, Advocacy, Lack of Missions Education, Leaders Misunderstanding on Missions
3. Leadership – Lack of Vision of Pastors, Sacred & Secular Divide
4. Partnership – Lack of Trust, Disunity of the Body of Christ
5. Support – No Church & Parents Support, Low Expectation, Resource Development

Together we also came up with a consensus that there is a need to create solution groups to focus on the identified solutions namely:

1. National Youth Missions Congress & Events/ Conferences
2. Prayer
3. Resources – Training & Training Directory, Funds
4. Media – Social Networks, Music & Drama, Sports
5. Training More Mobilizers

As part of the different solution groups organized to address the challenges, our service for our Lord in mobilizing youths for missions has just begun. I would to ask you to continue to pray for God's wisdom and creative solutions as you connect and meet with your group so that the Filipino youth will be empowered today to become the future tentmakers, missionaries, mobilizers and member care providers.

Let's continue to work together and encourage one another. Together we can see our vision & mission statement "**Raising Generations of Filipino Youth for Cross-cultural Missions**" become a reality for God's greatest glory!

Another set of PMA members met at the Church of the Risen Lord, July 23, 2011 for another Member Care forum also known as the "Knowing Me, Knowing You" forum. PMA staff who came were Dr. Rey Taniajura, Bibien Limlingan, and Joel Syypap. Its partner member, Church of the Risen Lord, was represented by its new mission pastor, Ptr. Zeppelin Canlas, Mr. San Agustin, their elder, and Ptr. Viola Martin. Other mission organizations were CBAP represented by Ptr Ruel Muje, Operation Mobilization, by Ptr. Jun Diaz, and Faith Baptist Church by Aldwin Fernandez. Also introduced is Lou Mandalupe who is the coordinator for Network Member Care.

Despite an incoming typhoon inducing strong rains, the people came and the meeting was started with a devotion by Dr Rey Taniajura from Psalm 127 and its relation with the Great Commission. Each of the orgs, including PMA, took turns introducing themselves, their organizations, and their prayer requests and updates:

- **ACM** – Pray for Meg Alag as she is undergoing physical recovery for Bell's palsy and pneumonia
- **PMA Adopt a People** – continue to pray even for the month of August as this is month of Ramadan. Pray for the "Bless the Muslims" prayer day on Sept 10
- **Operation Mobilization (OM)** – MV Doulos is now retired and is replaced by a new ship, Logos Hope. Pray that this ship will visit the Philippines next year. Also for Global Challenge which will be held on April 10-12, 2012
- **Faith Baptist Church** – pray for their upcoming Kairos course to be conducted by OMFer Liberty Belandres. Pray that it will be followed up by Member care. September is their missions month.
- **Conservative Baptist Association of the Philippines (CBAP)** – pray that they will be able to fulfil their vision of having 2000 churches by 2025. Also for their mission events such as Mission Possible, Kairos and have short term missions.
- **CRL** – pray for a School of Missions to be established in partnership with PMA
- **PMA** – pray that many *Pinoys* will consider India for short or long term opportunities. Opportunities such as bible teachers are available.

SEALINK in Bali, Indonesia

The 2011 SEALINK was held in Bali, Indonesia during the last week of July. About eighteen participants from the Philippines took part in the event led by Ptr. Lloyd Estrada. SEALINK missions network is a network of like minded missionaries and mission agencies. The vision of SEALINK is "a transformational church planting movement among all peoples of Southeast Asia so these people will then join us in worshipping Christ and fulfilling the Great Commission." Its mission is "connecting the Body of Christ's people, churches, organizations and resources together in order to serve and reach all of SEAsia's people more effectively." SEALINK is held annually with its first meeting held in Malaysia in 2003.

One of the results of SEALINK is producing a book about the Unreached People Group profile for each country in SEA. The Muslim Peoples of the Philippines is one such book.

National Director teaches in India, meets Dr. Howell

PMA National director, Dr. Rey Taniajura, taught a Restorative Justice and an integration class for five doctoral students, including one Filipino, on June 6 to 10 at Dehradun, India. The class is part of the doctor of ministry (D.Min.) program in peace studies of the Asia Graduate School of Theology (AGST) hosted by the International Graduate School of Leadership (IGSL). Dr. Taniajura is a faculty of IGSL teaching the community development track of the intercultural studies program of the seminary.

With Dr. Taniajura co-teaching the class was Dr. Karl Dortzbach of Peacemaker Ministries, U.S.A. Dr. Dortzbach is the program coordinator of the PhD in Peace Studies program of AGST. The class was held at the New Theological College in Dehradun. The chief executive officer of the college, George Kuruvilla, is one of the students of the D.Min. Program. Mr. Kuruvilla and Dr. Taniajura also explored possibilities of supporting short-term mission trips for young people of the two countries they represent.

While in India, Dr. Taniajura also visited Bobby Ferrer, first secretary and consul of the Philippine Embassy in New Delhi, India. Bobby went with Dr. Taniajura to Dehradun and interacted with Dr. Dortzbach and the five doctoral students. Later, he and Dr. Taniajura met with Dr. Richard Howell and Ptr. Karl Smith of the Delhi International Christian Fellowship (DICF).

Bobby and wife Jude attend DICF when they are in New Delhi. Bobby also serves as a member of DICF's board of directors. Dr. Howell is the general secretary of the India Evangelical Fellowship and Asia Evangelical Association. Dr. Howell likewise expressed interest for possible mission initiatives of the Philippines to support Indian missions.

On June 12, Bobby invited Dr. Taniajura to attend the Philippine Independence Day celebration at the Philippine chancery in New Delhi. This year the Philippines celebrated its 113th year as an independent nation.

World Team mission outreach in Catanduanes visited

On behalf of Philippine Missions Association, PMA national director Dr. Rey Taniajura visited the ministry of World Team in Panganiban, Catanduanes on April 29. He was accompanied by his wife June and Atty. Roy Valenzuela, National Prison Ministry Philippines (NPMP) board chairman and president, and his wife Vilma.

Bryan Martin and teammates Tom Buursma and Teng Candelaria together with their wives welcomed Dr. Taniajura's group. World Team is pioneering an approach of reaching the locals with the Word of God taking into consideration the context of the people that they are reaching. After the briefing on the ministry of World Team by team leader Bryan, Dr. Taniajura also explored how PMA can provide networking support to the ministries that are being conducted in province by churches and mission agencies.

KAIROS COURSE held at Sea view, Marbella Bldg, in Roxas Blvd

On June 8, 15, 22, and 29, the JESUS, THE MESSIAH CONGREGATION, a denomination with 13 churches hosted a Kairos Course for its pastors, lay leaders and partners from New Millennium Evangelical Church, Upper Room International Family Ministry, Overcomers International Ministries and Foursquare Church in Antipolo. Nineteen participants graduated from the course.

Course facilitators were Bibien Limlingan and Dr. Rey Taniajura of Philippine Missions Association. After completion of the course, the following commitments for missions were made: 13 of the graduates committed to pray for unreached peoples, 6 as Goers, 6 committed to support missions (Givers), 8 expressed intention to help in missions mobilization (Mobilizers), 2 as Welcomers, 4 as Senders and 6 wanted to be involved in Missionary Care.

Senior Pastor and Director, Ptr. Buddy Agunat shared his plan to require pastors and church workers of his denomination to do Kairos as a way of mobilizing the entire denomination to become active in missions. Ptr. Buddy's plan also include promoting the Kairos course to the greater body of Christ, completing Shalom Prayer Garden (House of Prayer for the Nations) in Mariveles, Bataan to strengthen their prayer involvement in missions and organize several missions exposure trips to unreached areas.

Butuan City pastors attend Community Development seminar

A one-day orientation seminar on community development was held for Butuan City evangelical pastors on May 27. The seminar was jointly conducted by Elder Kwan Soo Lee, director of the Canaan Farmers School in Pampanga and Dr. Rey Taniajura of PMA. The event was held at the Vineyard Church in the city pastored by Ian Calo, who also hosted the event.

More than 70 pastors and church workers were in attendance. They heard from Elder Lee the story on how Korea was transformed because of a change in worldview. On the other hand, Dr. Taniajura oriented the participants on the resources that Disciple Nations Alliance has to help local churches introduce the concept of transformational development in communities. Dr. Taniajura teaches Introduction to Community Transformation at the International Graduate School of Leadership (IGSL).

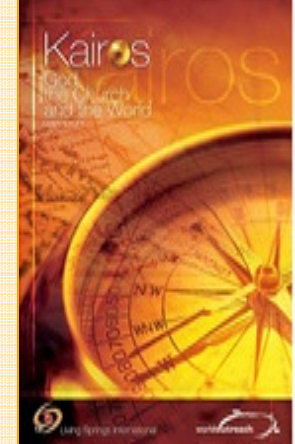
